Domestic Violence Documentation Matters: Health Records in the Courts

Bio : Judge Eugene M. Hyman retired from the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara (San Jose) where, for 20 years, he presided over cases in the criminal, civil, probate, family, and delinquency divisions of the court many of which had domestic violence issues present. He has presided over an adult domestic violence court and in 1999 presided over the first juvenile domestic violence and family violence court in the United States. The court received a United Nations Public Service Award in 2008. Judge Hyman has presented in Germany, Canada, Australia, USA, as well as New Zealand. Intro: Medical records are frequently used in cases that appear before the criminal, family, juvenile, and probate, and civil divisions of the court. Judge Hyman will give examples of how the records might be used in the various courts as well as examples of how the content of medical reports might be improved to assist judges, witness, and juries. Well written medical reports make it less likely that the healthcare professional will need to appear in court. They also make it more likely that justice will be administered.
